THE BENEFITS OF BRITISH WOOL








Founded by the Smith family of Shetland, Jamieson & Smith have been around since the 1930s. In 2004, the Smith family retired and J&S joined with Curtis Wool Direct in Yorkshire. J&S continues to be staffed by Shetlanders and remains a stand-alone company. The profits received from the sale of real Shetland wool and real Shetland wool products go back into the Shetland economy and are passed on to the wool producer.

Jamieson & Smith purchase Shetland wool from over 700 of Sheltand's crofters and farmers which is over 80% of the wool produced in Shetland. This plays an important part in sustaining Sheltand's fragile crofting industry, as well as their textiles industry and heritage.

Shetland wool is an incredibly natural and sustainable fibre, and is world renowned for its fineness and warmth. Shetland sheep graze on the islands' hills and beaches eating wild heather and seaweed. This diet, along with the not-so-great weather, makes Shetland wool soft, strong and warm. Shetland Wool is also very diverse – it's perfect for hand-knitting.



Sheep farming for the production of high-quality wool has been the main form of agriculture in the Falkland Islands for over 170 years.

All Falkland wool is **fully traceable** from the dedicated wool growers.

The Falkland Islands enjoys a beautiful environment for rearing sheep for 'snow-white' wool production. With an extensive rangeland farming system, beaches and cliff-lined coasts, it is **home to 80 sheep farms and abundant wildlife**.


Stage 1: Rearing

WYS production begins on the fells and hillsides of Great Britain.
The finest breeds are picked to ensure a high-quality finished product. The untreated fleeces are sent to Bradford where they are scoured, carded, combed and finally delivered to WYS in top condition.



Stage 2: Drawing

Our first operation is to prepare the raw material. This is called drawing. The raw material passes through pins on a number of machines (similar to combing your hair) to straighten the fibres so they are parallel and even. At WYS we have four operations of drawing. After the final passage we have reduced the wool to suitable weight for the spinning machine.



Stage 3: Spinning

Spinning has been performed for centuries using the same basic principle. At WYS we produce thousands of kilos per week using sophisticated, high-tech machinery. The purpose of spinning is to reduce the thickness of the wool.


To achieve this, the fibres are drafted out to produce a single yarn of suitable thickness.



Stage 4: Winding

After spinning we wind the yarn onto cones removing any imperfections such as thick and uneven areas or vegetable matter.

The next process is folding which involves twisting single spun yarns together to make different categories of wool for example 4ply and DK.



Stage 5 : Dyeing

Our in-house laboratory and specialised yarn dyeing facility gives us the luxury of being able to develop our own colours and quickly react to changing trends in the market. Our environmentally conscious process allow up to six colours to be applied to the yarn.



Stage 6: Finishing

The finishing stage is where yarn is balled or reeled into hanks. It is then passed to our warehouse where it is banded and packed in to boxes ready for distribution to our worldwide community of crafters.

The yarn creates a super-soft breathable fabric with graceful drape and superb sheen, making it a fantastic choice for summer tops, cardigans and sweaters. Elements DK also enhances lace, colourwork and textures beautifully.
